Boca Regional Garners Top Hospital Ranking...Again!

IN U.S. NEWS & WORLD REPORT

Boca Raton Regional Hospital has again been cited as a top-ranked regional hospital in *U.S. News & World Report's* 2015-2016 annual listing of America's Best Hospitals, marking the fourth time in the last five years the Hospital has received the designation. Boca Regional is ranked 12th out of nearly 300 hospitals in Florida and 4th out of approximately 70 hospitals in the Miami-Fort Lauderdale metro area, a significant advance from its previous rankings of 21st and 9th, respectively.

This accolade comes on the heels of Boca Regional being recognized in May by *U.S. News & World Report* as high-performing in three common care specialties — heart failure, hip replacement and knee replacement.

"We are honored to once again receive this recognition from *U.S.*

News & World Report," said Jerry Fedele, President and CEO of Boca Raton Regional Hospital. "It is truly gratifying to be acknowledged in such a prestigious fashion for the care we provide and to see us continue to rise in the rankings."

The 26th annual edition of Best Hospitals showcases 750 of the nation's nearly 5,000 hospitals and includes the 520 best regional hospitals in metro areas with populations of more than one million, as well as the best children's hospitals. Fewer than 150 are nationally ranked in at least one of 16 medical specialties. The rest of the recognized hospitals met a standard of performance nearly as demanding in one or more specialties.

"Patients deserve high-quality information on hospitals," said Ben

Harder, Chief of Health Analysis at *U.S. News & World Report*. "We strive to provide them with the most comprehensive data available so they can make more informed decisions together with their doctor about where to undergo treatment."

The specialty rankings and data were produced for *U.S. News & World Report* by RTI International, a leading research organization based in North Carolina. *U.S. News & World Report* used both the specialty rankings and its recently published Best Hospitals for Common Care ratings to produce the Best Regional Hospitals.

Over the past 26 years, the Best Hospitals rankings have helped guide millions of patients and their families to high-quality hospital care when they need it most.

Boca Raton Regional Hospital is again the recipient of an "A" grade in the latest Hospital Safety Score® ratings, administered for the spring of 2015 by The Leapfrog Group, an independent, national nonprofit organization focused on healthcare safety and accountability.

This comes on the heels of the Hospital having earned another "A" grade in the fall of 2014.

Issued biannually, the Hospital Safety Score uses 28 measures of publicly available hospital safety data to

produce a single grade representing a hospital's overall success in keeping patients safe from infections, injuries and medical and medication errors. Less than a third of the more than 2,500 general hospitals in the United States earned an "A" grade.

The versatile imaging technology provides mammograms with high resolution, low radiation and excellent detection for patients with all types of breast tissues, resulting in a more confident screening.

While other programs moved quickly to introduce first-generation technology, the Hospital waited until

it could provide its patients with the latest in digital breast tomosynthesis. SenoClaire is the only 3D breast tomosynthesis approved by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration that delivers the same low dose as 2D screenings, with a 3D view dose at least 40 percent lower than other 3D mammography on the market.

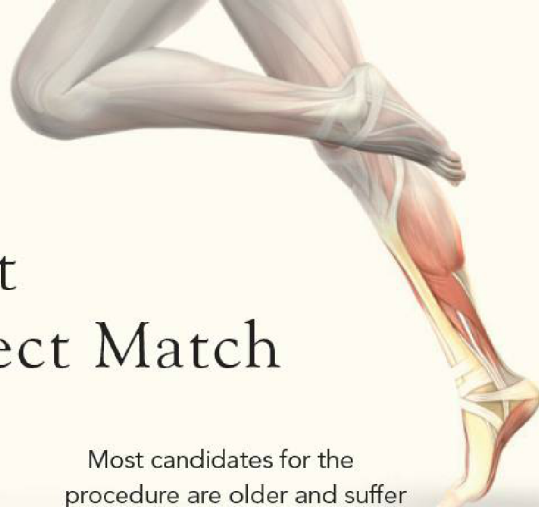
The Institute's physicians believe that using 3D mammography can help improve cancer detection in patients with dense breasts. Common among women, dense breasts have more fibrous or glandular tissue versus fatty tissue.

Though cancer is more likely to develop in dense breasts, 2D mammography may not always accurately detect it.

"We are pleased to bring our patients the latest in 3D mammography, advancing our ability to provide women with a more personalized and precise screening process," said Kathy Schilling, MD, Medical Director of the Lynn Women's Health & Wellness Institute. "As we know, there is a better rate of survival when cancer is discovered and treated early. This technology marks another significant step forward in enhancing our clinicians' ability to detect masses and small microcalcifications, which can represent cancer at its most curable stage."

Total Ankle Replacement Now A Perfect Match



Boca Raton Regional Hospital orthopaedic surgeon Justin Weatherall, MD,

fellowship-trained in foot and ankle surgery, is one of a select few in the area performing total ankle replacement on a patient-specific basis. This procedure ensures that the new joint is a perfect match with the patient's anatomy.

Total ankle replacement can be the preferred option over ankle fusion because the patient has the ability to maintain motion at the ankle joint, whereas with ankle fusion all motion at the ankle joint is lost. By retaining motion at the joint, arthritis in the adjacent joints may be prevented.

"The system used ensures that the alignment of the implant is accurate and matches the patient's specific anatomy," said Dr. Weatherall, who completed his fellowship at the OrthoCarolina O.L. Miller Foot and Ankle Institute. "Theoretically, improved alignment will increase the longevity of the implant. It also significantly decreases the surgical time, which may lead to a more positive outcome and a potential decrease in post-operative pain."

Most candidates for the procedure are older and suffer from different types of ankle arthritis, including rheumatoid arthritis, post-traumatic arthritis and degenerative arthritis. Some post-operative restrictions are placed on the patient's activities in order to lengthen the life of the implant. Low impact exercises like walking or swimming are allowed after approximately two to three months after the surgery.

"Typically, the length of stay in the hospital is one or two nights and most patients go home from the hospital instead of a rehab facility," Dr. Weatherall said. "After six weeks they start actual physical therapy and are full weight-bearing in a temporary walking boot."

Got Milk?

TOPPEL FAMILY PLACE BECOMES A DEPOT FOR BREAST MILK

Boca Raton Regional Hospital has joined forces with Mothers' Milk Bank of Florida (MMBFL) as a participating member to receive Pasteurized Donor Human Milk (PDHM) used to treat premature and critically ill babies. Mothers of premature infants are often unable to provide them with their own breast milk due to illness, medications or other complications.

This milk is urgently needed and the mission of MMBFL is to ensure this life-saving resource is available for babies in need. Boca Regional's Toppel Family Place serves as the first milk depot in Palm Beach County for interested donors who qualify.

Potential donors must provide a complete medical and lifestyle history and undergo blood tests similar to the screening process used at blood banks before being assigned a donor number. Women interested in qualifying as a donor should call MMBFL at 407.248.5050 to determine their eligibility.

Lynn Cancer Institute, First Facility in Florida to Use Esteya® To Treat Skin Cancer Patients



The Eugene M. & Christine E. Lynn Cancer Institute at Boca Raton Regional Hospital continues to offer cutting-edge treatment options for its patients with Esteya®, a high-dose rate electronic skin surface brachytherapy system. This device offers skin cancer patients with basal cell and squamous cell carcinoma a non-invasive option that results in more precise radiation delivery with minimal post-procedure downtime.

Brachytherapy is a type of treatment that brings a radiation source close to the cancer site. Esteya, a new and improved electronic skin surface brachytherapy device, delivers a low-energy X-ray, which results in less destruction to surrounding tissue, fewer side effects and a faster recovery. It is ideal for patients with cancer in

cosmetically sensitive areas, such as the face and hands. In addition, the low-energy X-ray also requires less shielding, so treatment areas are not limited as they are with traditional brachytherapy.

“Implementation of Esteya will help bring high-dose rate brachytherapy to more patients,” said Michael Kasper, MD, radiation oncologist at the Lynn Cancer Institute. “While the improved workflow of Esteya will make us as clinicians more efficient, accessibility for the patient is the primary advantage of the system. In general, electronic brachytherapy also offers shorter treatment times and more effective dosing.”

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Genomic Health:

THE TIME IS NOW

More than a decade has passed since the completion of the human genome study mapping the six billion DNA particles found in each human cell. It has been over 20 years since the discovery of the inherited BRCA breast and ovarian cancer gene. When these breakthroughs were announced there was a flurry of excitement, but it was hard to imagine the impact genetic discoveries could have.

It turns out the answer was just around the corner — Next Generation Sequencing. This new technology can

be found at the Eugene M. & Christine E. Lynn Cancer Institute's Morgan Pressel Center for Cancer Genetics.

"We can now detect inherited mutations with a single test studying up to 100 different cancer genes," said Louise Morrell, MD, Medical Director at the Lynn Cancer Institute.

"We can test tumors for precise genomic markers, allowing us to use targeted therapies and as a result, we are seeing extraordinary responses to these treatments."

Through this technological breakthrough, patients at the Institute can learn how genetic testing applies to them, how it affects their treatment and what importance it will have on their family. The Morgan Pressel Center for Cancer Genetics is leading the way in utilizing the latest advances in genomic health.

Boca Regional Introduces New, Ultra-Minimally Invasive Method to Treat Afib Patients

Boca Raton Regional Hospital's Richard G. Cartledge, MD, FACS, has begun performing ultra-minimally invasive left atrial appendage ligation for atrial fibrillation patients who are on anticoagulants such as Coumadin, Xarelto® or Effient®. Dr. Cartledge, who is Chief of Cardiovascular Surgery at the Hospital's Christine E. Lynn Heart & Vascular Institute, is one of a select group of surgeons nationally using this method, which involves making two microscopic incisions in order to seal off the left atrial appendage (LAA) in patients where anticoagulants are contraindicated or who refuse to be on such medications.

In patients with atrial fibrillation, clots can form in these areas and can "flick off," resulting in stroke or other serious problems.

What separates Dr. Cartledge's method from other minimally invasive procedures is the size of the incisions

he makes underneath the arm in the left side of the chest. Both incisions are less than 1/5 of an inch in diameter, compared to the standard minimally invasive method that involves an incision of about 2.5 inches. The procedure also eliminates the need for a post-operative chest tube.

During the procedure, an ultra-thin, fiber optic, high-definition camera is inserted through one of the two incisions, while the other is used for an instrument port.

This allows for a clear 360-degree view of inside the chest and the portion of the heart from where the LAA emanates. Dr. Cartledge then accesses the LAA and a device is inserted that seals off the LAA at its base. This totally excludes the appendage from circulation so clots can no longer be formed in that structure.

The LAA is reabsorbed by the body over a short period of time and the potential for clots is eliminated. With anticoagulants no longer being required, the procedure also greatly reduces the chance for bleeds elsewhere in the body.

"This ultra-minimally invasive procedure is efficient, safe, quick and is done with minimum discomfort," Dr. Cartledge said. "The patients essentially need only Tylenol® post-operatively for pain and they can go home the next day. It really changes the paradigm of how to deal with afib in a patient that should not be on anticoagulants or doesn't want to be on anticoagulants."
